#### Sports Clubs

I continue to liaise with the various sports clubs in the town regarding both their ground maintenance and any other issues or requests that arise.

Some of these include the Lease & Licence requests from Ammanford Cricket Club, Pantyffynnon Rugby Football Club and Ammanford Sports Association. I have already met with representatives of 2 of the clubs and further meetings are scheduled.

Ammanford Association Football Club have advised that they will be submitting a planning application to Carmarthenshire County Council as they wish to upgrade their floodlights to LED.

## **Utilities**

I am still awaiting confirmation from CCC that the electricity account for the compound area of the park has been transferred over to Ammanford Town Council.

EDF have now switched the meter in Margaret Street public conveniences to a smart meter and I am awaiting a date for the Park toilets to be changed over to a smart meter.

# **Playgrounds**

The secondary gate for Ammanford playground has now been installed.

The Splashpad maintenance company are currently in the process of repainting 3 pieces of equipment that have been identified during the de-commissioning process as requiring maintenance. A local resident has raised the issue of water pooling on the ground in Ammanford Playground, I am currently investigating this issue.

The gate on the MUGA at Riverway has previously been damaged and taken off its hinges, this has now been removed until it is able to be re-instated.

# Ammanford Park

A total of 12 solar lights have now been installed around the park. The lights come on at dusk at 30% capacity for 5 hours at which point they drop to 20% unless they detect movement when the light output temporary increases to 100%. This project has been subsidised by Mynydd Y Betws grant funding. The Monitoring claim form has been submitted to the Bureau. I have spoken with a number of park users who have provided positive feedback.

Unfortunately, there was another instance of vandalism where yet another of the lights in Memorial Avenue have been smashed and an emergency electrician had to be called to make safe. The entire lantern head has had to be removed. This is unrepairable as the lights are made of plastic.

## Town Centre

I have spoken with the Town's Regeneration Team at CCC regarding the unused dining pods that were previously being used by Vive le Crepe. They have informed me that they are making enquiries with other businesses in the town to see if they have use for them.

## Task Force Meeting 13/3/2025

I attended the recent Task Force meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2025. The following information was provided:

- Tim Tacluso have now completed their work in the 3 towns (Carmarthen, Ammanford & Llanelli) and are now moving onto the 10 towns everyone agreed that the paved areas look much improved after being cleaned.
- The 5 large planters at the bottom of Quay Street will be reinstated once the resurfacing work has been completed and these will be maintained going forward.
- They also advised that they are currently rolling out a new digital system & works can be tracked/allocated to operatives' individual tablets.
- CCC also advised that 20% of litter bins (463) are being removed across the county
- Enforcement Team are currently running at 50% capacity, but recruitment is being undertaken.
- CCC have also signed up to a Grassland Management Policy aiming to increase biodiversity & pollinators.
- Nothing to report from Dyfed Powys Police
- CCC Housing reported that Town Hall proposals are in place which will provide much needed housing in Ammanford. The planning application should be submitted next month with a potential tender date of July and works to commence between October & December. There will be no demolition, and the façade will be kept virtually the same. There will be a further update at the next meeting.
- Hywel Thomas (Leisure/Sports/Community Development) informed the meeting of a current Empowerment programme being undertaken with Year 10 pupils of local schools. The course is 10 weeks and works with those who are at risk of drug/alcohol misuse.
- His department is also looking at holding further street basketball sessions and hopefully street football in the town centre to coincide with the Euros.
- Ammanford Leisure Centre currently has 2193 members. There are currently 715 enrolled on it's Learn to Swim programme.
- They are looking at options for on-site parking.

- Elinos Walters then spoke about the possibility of setting up some walks in Ammanford in partnership with the Countyside Team/Actif and local community groups/individuals. The hope is that they can create some walking trails.
- A triathlon will be held again in Ammanford in April.
- There were 787 visits to the Hwb in Ammanford during January & February 2025.
- Retailers are being asked to list on CCC's website for free, currently only 7 food & drink retailers have listed.
- The members agreed that a Chamber of Trade was needed in Ammanford.
- Highways updated members about the 20mph review, 1604 people had commented which was being reported to Cabinet.
- Highways will undertake resurfacing works throughout 2025-26.
- Cllr C Evans raised concerns that had been reported to him regarding the need for yellow lines outside the flats opposite the fire station, residents are struggling with visibility when exiting the premises as cars are parked obstructing their view. Cllr Evans had also been contacted about the parking situation on Station Road due to the number of vehicles being parked on the road by private businesses.
- Luke Milward advised that the wifi scheme in the town was closed and that beacons are being removed. Without the necessary IT support, this is now a security risk. Other towns have reported an improvement in anti-social behaviour since the removal of WiFi.
- The interim Clerk then raised queries over the old Sophia Nails building this is still with the insurance company & SWTRA. Confirmation was given that the shelter in Carregamman car park is being painted, then Heol Wallasey and then the railings on the square will be painted. The resurfacing works are due to be finished by the end of March/beginning of May. The Enforcement Team are currently dealing with the Post Office building. The interim Clerk gave a brief update regarding the installation of solar lighting in Ammanford Park, potential events and the work that the council has & continues to undertake.

The members thanked the interim Clerk and commended the Council and staff for their continued engagement.

- Tessa Bufton informed the members that they are still awaiting the Economic Vision Statement.
- Luke Milward updated members regarding the resurfacing works, the works to be undertaken at the railway crossing, the next round of funding for refreshing town centres will re-open on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2025.
- Sarah from Menter Dinefwr reported on the success of the St Davids Day event in the town centre and again thanked Ammanford Town Council for their support. The winner of the St David's Day competition was Tenovus. The next Tak Force meeting will be on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

# **Correspondence**

Request from Ammanford Cricket Club to hold a charity day in Ammanford Park on 24.08.25 Email from Ammanford Cricket Club advising that they will be using 'NV Play' to record Senior Games in the park.

Request from Ammanford AFC requesting support from the Town Council in changing the current halogen floodlights to LED floodlights. This is to meet Football Association of Wales Infrastructure Criteria I.14. The project will involve changing the current 20 x Halogen Lights, and replacing with 28 x LED lights. The club will shortly be applying for full planning permission to accompany this project.
