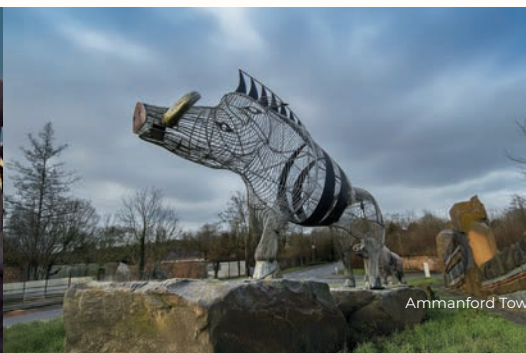
I am especially pleased to report that Ammanford Town Council has received an unqualified audit for the 2024–2025 financial year.

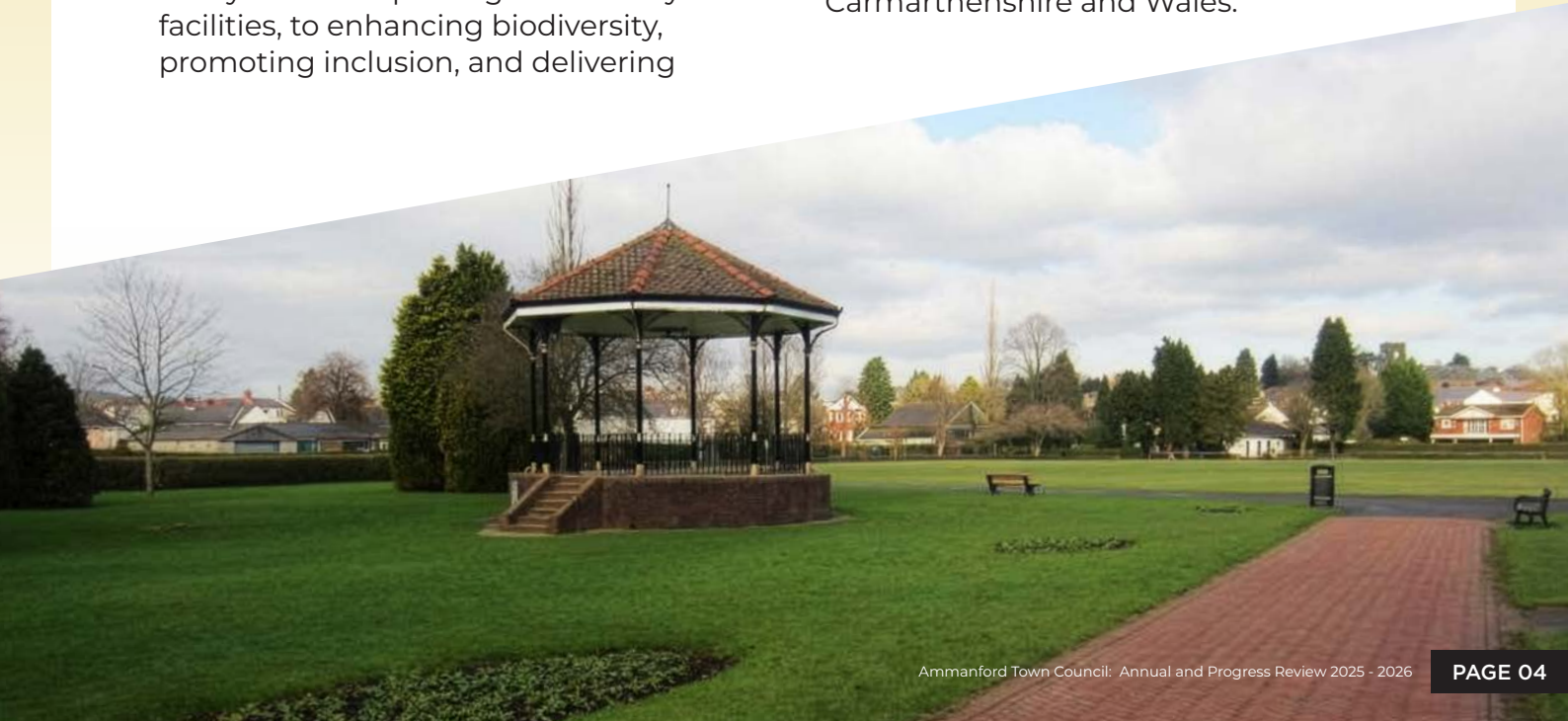

THE WARD

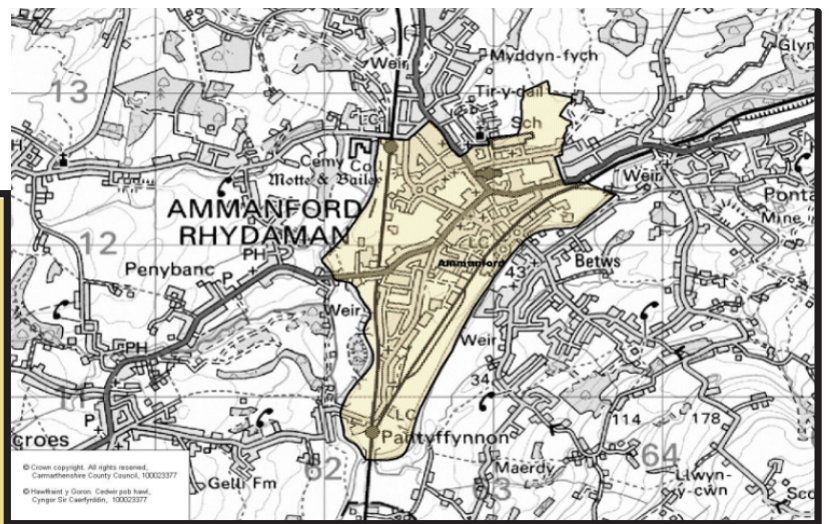
Ammanford Town Council serves the town of Ammanford and surrounding communities.

The Full Council meets on the last Monday of every month (except August and December) and is supported by committees including Finance and Personnel, Asset, Environmental & Biodiversity plus Community Well-being, Engagement and Events.

PARKS, OPEN SPACES AND ASSETS



Ammanford Town Council continues to prioritise the maintenance, improvement, and development of its parks, open spaces, and community assets, recognising their importance to the well-being, safety, and enjoyment of residents and visitors.

Throughout 2025–2026, the Council has delivered a wide range of improvements across its sites, ensuring that facilities remain safe, accessible, and welcoming. These works have included both essential maintenance and targeted enhancements designed to improve the overall quality and usability of public spaces.

To support ongoing safety and responsiveness, the Council has implemented a programme of **weekly park inspections**, ensuring that any issues are identified and addressed promptly.

In addition, a **“Report a Problem” feature on the Council’s website** enables residents to raise concerns directly, supporting a proactive and community-informed approach to maintenance.

In addition to infrastructure improvements, the Council has also focused on enhancing the visual appeal, biodiversity, and community use of its green spaces. This includes the introduction of new flower beds outside Ammanford Tennis Courts, delivered in partnership with local Year 5 and 6 students, encouraging community involvement and environmental awareness.

A key highlight of the year has been the introduction of a **community orchard**, delivered in partnership with **Keep Wales Tidy** and supported by local volunteers. This initiative not only enhances biodiversity but also creates a shared community asset that promotes environmental education, sustainability, and long-term community engagement.

Further works within Ammanford Park have included the removal of outdated and unsafe structures, including a wall surrounding shrub and tree areas, which posed a safety risk. This area has been replaced with new planters and flower beds, improving both safety and the aesthetic quality of the park. Seating areas within the park, playground, and Splash Pad have also been refurbished, with additional seating introduced to improve accessibility and comfort for visitors.

These ongoing improvements, combined with strengthened inspection, reporting processes, and community-led initiatives, reflect the Council’s commitment to maintaining high-quality public spaces that support community well-being, encourage outdoor activity, and provide safe, attractive environments for all.

KEY IMPROVEMENTS AND INVESTMENTS INCLUDE:

- Installation, refurbishment, and introduction of new benches and seating areas across parks and recreational spaces
- Replacement of fencing and implementation of safety improvements to ensure secure and accessible environments
- Repairs and removal of outdated play equipment to address safety risks
- Drainage improvements to enhance usability of park areas throughout the year
- Repainting of gates, railings, and fencing, including the refurbishment of the Ammanford Park Memorial Gates
- Refurbishment of Ammanford Park public toilets
- Deep cleaning and repainting of Splash Pad railings, alongside wider maintenance of the facility
- Community Splash Pad refurbishment to improve quality and user experience
- Commencement of the Riverway Park redevelopment project, marking a significant long-term investment in community infrastructure
- Installation of defibrillators to improve public safety and emergency response within community spaces



COMMUNITY SAFETY AND WELL-BEING

Ammanford Town Council remains committed to promoting community safety, health, and well-being through a range of practical initiatives and community-led activities.

The Council continues to maintain a network of publicly accessible defibrillators across Ammanford, including the installation of a new unit at the Cricket Club in Ammanford Park.

Regular checks are carried out to ensure all equipment remains fully operational and ready for use in an emergency. To further support public awareness and confidence, the Council has also delivered **community defibrillator training sessions**, equipping residents with the knowledge and skills to respond effectively in critical situations.

In partnership with national organisations such as the British Heart Foundation, the Council has worked to raise awareness of heart health and the importance of accessible life-saving equipment.

This has been supported through the installation of a commemorative bench within Ammanford Park, serving as a lasting reminder of the importance of this work and encouraging reflection and awareness within the community.

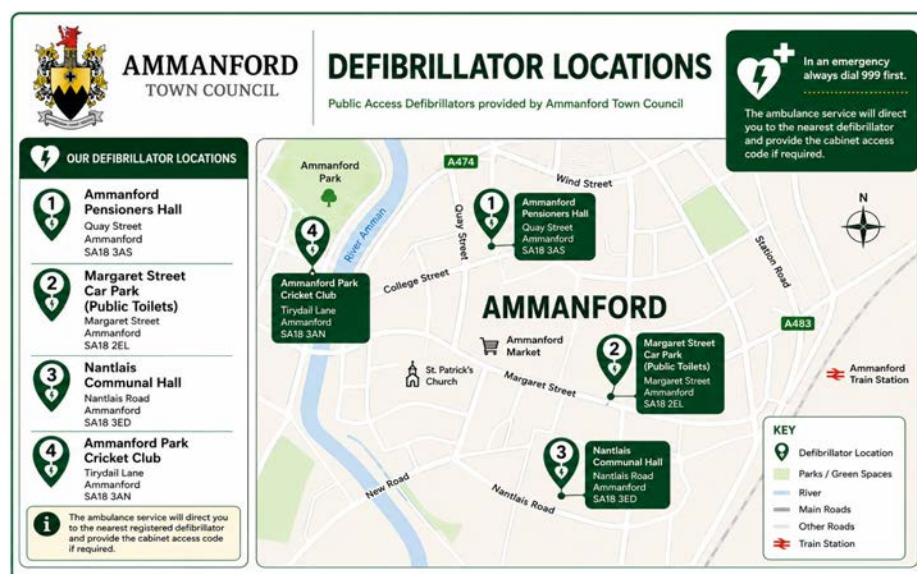
Alongside safety initiatives, the Council has continued to promote physical well-being through accessible activity programmes.

This has included the delivery of **tennis skills sessions** and **basketball skills sessions**, providing opportunities for residents, particularly young people, to engage in physical activity, develop new skills, and improve overall health and fitness.

These combined initiatives support the Council's wider objectives by:

- Enhancing community safety through accessible life-saving equipment and training
- Promoting public health awareness and preventative action
- Encouraging active lifestyles and physical well-being
- Supporting inclusive, community-based activities for all age groups
- Strengthening community resilience and confidence

Through continued investment in both safety infrastructure and well-being activities, the Council is helping to create a safer, healthier, and more connected community for the people of Ammanford.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY 2025 – 2026



The main source of Ammanford Town Council's income continues to be the Precept, which is the portion of council tax paid by households in Ammanford that is allocated directly to the Town Council. This funding enables the Council to deliver services, maintain facilities, and support community projects. Ammanford Town Council does not receive any income from Business Rates.

Additional income of £72,367.48 is generated through a variety of sources, including hire of the tennis courts, contributions from sports clubs towards the maintenance of sports fields, events.

On the expenditure side, total spending for the year was £467,071.95, covering core administration, open spaces, parks and playground maintenance, community financial assistance, community development activities, and members' allowances, as well as specific commitments such as the upkeep of the town's church clock.

Total earmarked and capital reserves held are: £146,267.63

At the end of the year the Council held General Reserves of £233,522.45

These funds are set aside for capital projects and to provide match funding when applying for external grants, ensuring the Council is well positioned to support future community improvements and investment opportunities.

The Council remains committed to maintaining strong financial management, transparency, and accountability, ensuring that public funds are used effectively to deliver value for the community.

WELL-BEING OF FUTURE GENERATIONS (WALES) ACT 2015

The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 places a legal duty on public bodies in Wales to carry out sustainable development and work towards improving the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being of Wales.

The Act requires public bodies to consider the long-term impact of their decisions, work collaboratively with communities and partners, prevent problems from occurring or worsening, and ensure that the needs of future generations are considered alongside those of current residents.

As part of this framework, public bodies must contribute towards achieving the seven National Well-being Goals and apply the Five Ways of Working:

Long-term, Prevention, Integration, Collaboration and Involvement.

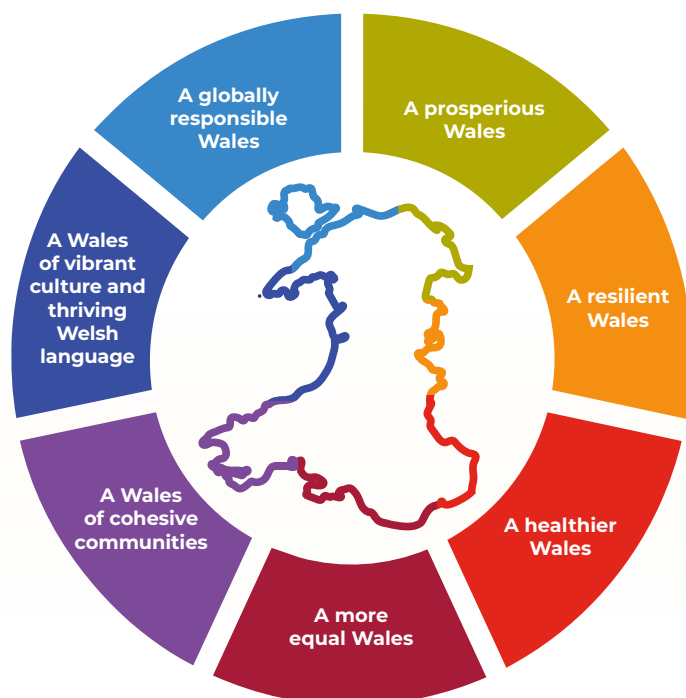
Although Ammanford Town Council is not a statutory Public Services Board member, the Council is committed to embracing the principles of the Act and ensuring that its policies, projects and services contribute positively to the well-being of the community both now and in the future.

This report has been prepared in accordance with Section 40 of the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 and demonstrates how Ammanford Town Council has contributed towards the Carmarthenshire Public Services Board objectives during 2025–2026.

NATIONAL WELL-BEING GOALS

THE FIVE WAYS OF WORKING

In order that Ammanford Town Council apply the sustainable development principle, there are five ways of working which we must follow: Long term; Prevention; Integration; Collaboration and Involvement.

The Council must ensure that everything we do has taken these

ways of working into consideration. The Council must think more about the long term; work better with local communities; look to prevent problems and take a more joined-up approach.

This will ensure we work together in a more robust and effective partnership approach.



LONG TERM The importance of balancing short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs.



PREVENTION How acting to prevent problems occurring or getting worse may help public bodies meet their objectives.



INTEGRATION Considering how the public body's well-being objectives may impact upon each of the well-being goals, on their other objectives, or on the objectives of other public bodies.



COLLABORATION Acting in collaboration with any other person (or different parts of the body itself) that could help the body to meet its well-being objectives.



INVOLVEMENT The importance of involving people with an interest in achieving the well-being goals, and ensuring that those people reflect the diversity of the area which the body serves.

HOW AMMANFORD TOWN COUNCIL INCORPORATES THE FIVE WAYS OF WORKING

Ammanford Town Council recognises the importance of embedding the Five Ways of Working as set out in the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, to contribute meaningfully to the Public Services Board (PSB) objectives.

While the Council has already worked in a way that reflects these principles in practice, formal adoption and integration into our governance framework has been delayed due to a necessary period of governance and financial catch-up following historic challenges.

With these priorities now substantially addressed, the Council is committed to fully embedding the Five Ways of Working — Long-term, Prevention, Integration, Collaboration, and Involvement — into our planning, decision-making, and performance monitoring processes.

This will ensure that our activities are strategically aligned with the PSB objectives, deliver sustained benefits to our community, and are transparent and accountable to the people of Ammanford.

AMMANFORD TOWN COUNCIL PROGRESS AGAINST THE CARMARTHENSHIRE PSB'S WELL-BEING OBJECTIVES (2023–2028)

The following outlines the progress made by Ammanford Town Council in 2025-2026 against each objective:

1 Sustainable Economy and Fair Employment

Although Ammanford Town Council is not responsible for economic development on the same scale as principal authorities, it plays an important role in supporting a sustainable local economy and promoting fair employment through its own practices, investment decisions, and community leadership.

The Council contributes to this objective by investing in the skills and development of its employees and councillors, ensuring staff are supported through fair employment practices and continuous professional development. This helps maintain a knowledgeable, resilient workforce capable of delivering high-quality services to the community.

The Council also supports the local economy by delivering community events that attract visitors, increase

footfall within the town centre and create opportunities for local businesses, traders and community organisations to thrive. Wherever possible, the Council seeks to procure goods and services locally, supporting businesses within the local economy and maximising the social value of public expenditure.

Through community grants, partnership working and investment in local infrastructure, parks and public spaces, Ammanford Town Council helps create an attractive and welcoming town that encourages people to live, work, visit and invest in the area. By combining responsible employment practices with investment in the local community, the Council contributes to building a stronger, more resilient and prosperous Ammanford for current and future generations.

2 Improving Well-being and Reducing Health Inequalities

A. Ammanford Town Council Parks and Playgrounds

Ammanford Town Council has continued to invest in improving the quality, safety, accessibility, and sustainability of its parks and play facilities for the benefit of residents and visitors. These investments form part of the Council's wider programme to enhance community spaces, ensuring that parks remain safe, welcoming, and inclusive environments that can be enjoyed by people of all ages and abilities.

Recognising the important role that parks and open spaces play in supporting physical activity, mental health, social interaction, and overall well-being, the Council has focused on creating attractive and accessible environments where children, young people, families, and older residents can play, exercise, relax, and connect with others. Improvements to play equipment, pathways, seating areas, and public facilities have helped ensure that these spaces are accessible to a wider range of users and continue to meet the needs of the community.

A major investment of £118,800 has been made in the redevelopment of Riverway Play Park, with completion scheduled for May 2026. The project forms part of the Council's long-

term commitment to revitalising and modernising play facilities across the town, transforming underused spaces into high-quality recreational areas that encourage active lifestyles and community engagement.

To further improve safety standards, the Council introduced a programme of weekly park inspections across all play areas and recreational facilities.

These inspections enable maintenance issues and potential safety concerns to be identified and addressed promptly, ensuring that facilities remain safe, clean, and fit for purpose. This proactive approach supports the long-term sustainability of the Council's assets and demonstrates its commitment to providing high-quality community facilities.

During 2025–2026, the Council also invested significantly in the maintenance and preservation of community assets across both Ammanford Park and the Recreation Ground. Refurbishment works were undertaken to the Memorial Gates at both sites, preserving important heritage features while improving their appearance and longevity. These gates provide a welcoming entrance to key community spaces and form an important part of the town's civic heritage.



The Council also completed refurbishment works to the public toilets within Ammanford Park, improving facilities for park users and helping to ensure they remain accessible, clean, and fit for purpose. These improvements contribute to a positive visitor experience and encourage greater use of the park by residents and visitors alike.

To maintain the high standards of the popular Splash Pad facility, the Council undertook a programme of refurbishment works, including the recoating and restoration of splash pad equipment to protect against wear and corrosion.

Specialist steam cleaning was also carried out to ensure the facility remained clean, safe, and welcoming throughout the operating season.

Further enhancements included the installation of additional seating throughout Ammanford Park and the Recreation Ground, providing more opportunities for residents to rest, socialise, and enjoy the outdoor environment.

The Council also introduced family picnic pods, creating attractive and comfortable spaces where families and groups can gather, enjoy refreshments, and spend quality time together.

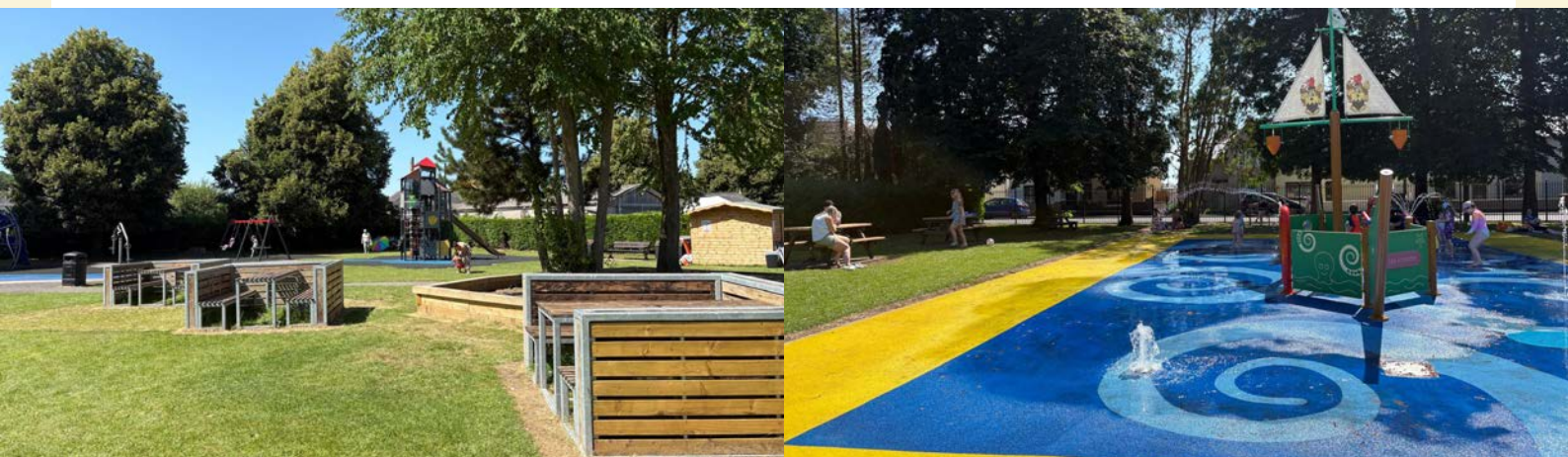
These additions have enhanced the overall visitor experience and encouraged greater use of the parks as community destinations.

Further investment was made in the maintenance and improvement of playground facilities across the town, ensuring that equipment remains compliant with safety standards and continues to provide enjoyable recreational opportunities for children and families. Combined with the introduction of weekly park inspections, these improvements demonstrate the Council's proactive approach to asset management and its commitment to supporting health, well-being, community safety, and environmental quality.

The Council continues to deliver and support a range of activities across its parks and open spaces, creating friendly and sociable opportunities for residents to be active, improve their well-being, and strengthen community connections. These projects collectively contribute to the creation of safe, attractive, and sustainable public spaces that enhance the quality of life for current and future generations.

Ammanford Park on Tir Y Dail Lane, the tennis courts offer a welcoming and accessible destination for both casual players and serious enthusiasts. The facility includes three hard-surfaced outdoor courts, all managed by Ammanford Town Council.

Visitors enjoy a pleasant, relaxed environment—surrounded by greenery, with easy access to nearby amenities and attractive views that enrich the playing experience. Booking a court is hassle-free via low-cost pay-and-play options or through affordable annual family and student passes.

B. Tennis Courts and Community Tennis Programme

Ammanford Town Council has continued to support active lifestyles and improve community well-being through the ongoing management and promotion of the tennis courts at Ammanford Park. Following the successful refurbishment of the courts, the facility has continued to provide residents of all ages with access to high-quality sporting facilities, encouraging regular physical activity and participation in sport.

During 2025–2026, the Council further enhanced community access to tennis through the introduction of the Barclays Free Park Tennis Programme, delivered in partnership with the Lawn Tennis Association (LTA).

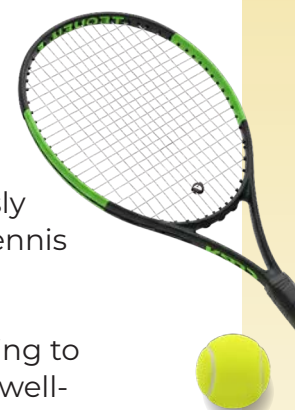
This initiative provides free tennis sessions for the community, removing financial barriers to participation and creating opportunities for people of all ages and abilities to become involved in the sport. A key element of the programme has been the support of local volunteer Tennis Activators, who have generously given their time to organise and lead sessions. Their commitment has helped create a welcoming and inclusive environment where residents can learn new skills, improve their fitness, build confidence, and develop social connections through sport.

In addition to the regular community sessions, a programme of free tennis sessions was delivered throughout the 2025 summer holidays, providing children, young people, and families with opportunities to stay active, learn new skills, and enjoy organised sporting activities during the school break.

These sessions proved popular with participants and helped encourage greater use of the tennis facilities while promoting healthy lifestyles and positive well-being.

The programme has been particularly successful in encouraging families, beginners, and those who may not previously have considered taking part in tennis to become active. By providing free, accessible opportunities for participation, the Council is helping to improve physical health, mental well-being, and community cohesion while maximising the use of an important community asset.

The continued use of the tennis courts, together with the introduction of Barclays Free Park Tennis and the delivery of free holiday activities, demonstrates the Council's commitment to promoting healthier lifestyles, reducing barriers to participation, and ensuring that high-quality recreational opportunities are available to everyone within the community.



C. Ammanford Splash Pad Overview

The Ammanford Park Splash Pad is a well-loved summer fixture; bright, accessible, and easy to use, bringing joy, refreshment, and outdoor play to families throughout the season. Perfect for beating the heat in a safe, enjoyable environment.

Situated in Ammanford Park, on Tir Y Dail Lane, SA18 3AN, and managed by Ammanford Town Council. A bright, colourful splash pad offering vibrant, water-based fun for children and families throughout the summer.

Features & Operation

- Operational from May to September
- Utilises an automatic timer system - typically active daily from around 10am to 6pm, making it easy and predictable for visitors.
- While compact in size, it's purposefully designed to provide just the right amount of splash-factor for children to cool off, play, and be merry.

What Makes It Special

- Family-friendly and accessible: Located near transport links and warm, fun surroundings—ideal for quick visits or extended park days.
- Safe and low risk: As with most splash pads, there's little to no standing water, removing many of the common safety concerns associated with deeper water play areas.



3 Community Events and Social Well-being

Throughout 2025–2026, Ammanford Town Council delivered an extensive programme of community events designed to improve well-being, encourage social interaction, support local businesses, celebrate local culture, and create opportunities for residents of all ages to participate in community life

A. Superhero Family Fun Day

The Superhero Family Fun Day provided a free family-focused event encouraging outdoor activity, social interaction, and community participation.

The event offered entertainment and activities for children and families, helping to reduce social isolation and create positive shared experiences within the community.





B. Ammanford Food Festival

The Ammanford Food Festival brought together local food producers, traders, community organisations, and visitors from across the region.

The event supported the local economy, increased footfall within the town centre, showcased local businesses, and promoted Ammanford as a destination for visitors.

C. Ammanford Pride

The event provided opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds to come together, enjoy entertainment, access information and support services, and participate in activities that promoted understanding, acceptance, and community cohesion.

By creating a safe and inclusive space, Ammanford Pride helped foster a sense of belonging and demonstrated the town's commitment to equality and diversity.

As well as its social benefits, the event generated additional footfall within the town centre, supporting local businesses and contributing to the local economy. 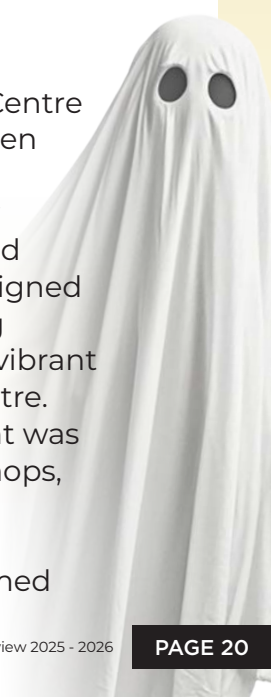

F. Halloween Spooktacular

The free community event provided a range of themed activities and entertainment designed to encourage participation, bring residents together, and create a vibrant atmosphere within the town centre. One of the highlights of the event was the pumpkin sculpturing workshops, where children and families had the opportunity to design and create their own Halloween-themed





pumpkin displays. These interactive sessions encouraged creativity, family participation, and community engagement.

Visitors were also able to meet a variety of spooky and magical Halloween characters, providing memorable photo opportunities and creating excitement for children throughout the day. The roaming characters added to the festive atmosphere and helped bring the event to life.

A popular feature of the event was the Halloween Fancy Dress Competition, which encouraged children and families to dress up in their favourite spooky costumes and take part in a fun community competition. The competition generated enthusiastic participation and helped create a lively and inclusive atmosphere across the town centre.

Alongside these activities, the event featured entertainment and attractions that encouraged residents to spend time within the town centre, supporting local businesses and increasing visitor footfall. The Halloween Spooktacular provided an opportunity for families to enjoy a free seasonal event while strengthening community connections and promoting town centre activity.

G. Remembrance Activities

Ammanford Town Council continued to support and participate in the annual Remembrance Service and Parade, one of the most important civic events in the town's calendar.

The event brought together residents, veterans, serving personnel, community organisations, schools, elected members, and representatives of local groups to honour those who have served and sacrificed in conflicts past and present.

The commemorations commenced with a service at the local church, providing an opportunity for reflection, prayer, and remembrance. The service brought together members of the community to pay tribute to those



who gave their lives in service to their country and to recognise the sacrifices made by armed forces personnel and their families.

Following the church service, participants joined the traditional parade procession through the town, walking together to the newly refurbished Grade II Listed Memorial Gates at Ammanford Park. The restoration of these historic gates has helped preserve an important part of the town's heritage and provided a fitting setting for the remembrance commemorations.



At the Memorial Gates, a wreath-laying ceremony was held, with representatives from the Royal British Legion, local organisations, community groups, schools, elected members, and members of the public laying wreaths and paying their respects. The ceremony provided a poignant opportunity for the community to come together in remembrance of those who have lost their lives in service and to honour the contribution of veterans both past and present.

The event continues to play a vital role in preserving local heritage, educating future generations about the importance of remembrance, and strengthening community cohesion. Through supporting and participating in these commemorations, the Council helps ensure that the sacrifices made by previous generations are remembered with dignity and respect.

H. Christmas Light Switch-On Event

The Christmas Light Switch-On continued to be one of Ammanford Town Council's flagship community events, bringing together residents, visitors, community groups, and local businesses to celebrate the start of the festive season. The event attracted significant attendance and created a vibrant and welcoming atmosphere throughout the town centre.

During 2025–2026, the Council introduced an enhanced Christmas lasershow - lighting display across the town centre, creating an even more festive and visually appealing environment for residents and visitors. The improved display helped transform the town centre into a seasonal destination, encouraging increased



visitor numbers and supporting local businesses during the important Christmas trading period.

As part of the celebrations, the Bandstand in Ammanford Park was specially decorated with festive lighting and seasonal displays, creating an attractive focal point for the community and providing opportunities for photographs and family enjoyment throughout the festive season.

The event featured a variety of entertainment, festive activities, food stalls, community participation, and family-friendly attractions, creating opportunities for residents of all ages to come together and celebrate. The evening concluded with the town's first-ever laser display show, providing a spectacular finale that illuminated the night sky and created a memorable experience for those in attendance. The introduction of the laser show represented an exciting new addition to the event programme and was extremely well received by the community.

A further highlight of the festive programme was the launch of Ammanford's first Gingerbread Trail, encouraging families and visitors to explore the town centre in search of festive gingerbread characters displayed in participating businesses and locations. The trail provided a fun and interactive activity for children and families while encouraging footfall throughout the town and supporting local retailers during the Christmas period.



The Council also supported the introduction of Ammanford's first Christmas Market, delivered in partnership with Ammanford Farmers Market and Carmarthenshire County Council. The market brought together local traders, artisan producers, food vendors, and



community organisations, providing additional opportunities for residents to shop locally and enjoy a festive community atmosphere. The event helped showcase local businesses and producers while further strengthening the town centre's role as a community hub during the festive season.

The Christmas Light Switch-On and associated festive activities played an important role in supporting community well-being, strengthening social connections, promoting civic pride, and boosting the local economy through increased town centre footfall and visitor spending.

5 Responding to the climate and nature emergencies



- **A. Bee-friendly planting**

Summer 2024 saw bee-friendly planting schemes introduced within Ammanford Park, flower beds near the Cricket Club, and the Town Centre.

These planting schemes support pollinators, enhance biodiversity, improve the visual appearance of public spaces, and contribute to creating a more resilient natural environment.

- **B. Engagement with One Voice Wales**

Established a community orchard in partnership with Keep Wales Tidy, supported by local volunteers, Special Olympics Carmarthenshire and Jac y Dôr Nursery. The project included the planting of fruit trees, spring bulbs and the installation of a bug hotel, creating a long-term community asset that promotes biodiversity, environmental education, volunteering and community ownership of green spaces.

- **C. Participation in the AGA Toolkit Pilot Study for Community & Town Councils**

The Council participated in the AGA Toolkit Pilot Study, a research initiative designed to assess and strengthen the democratic health of Community and Town Councils in Wales. Participation supports continuous improvement, good governance, and sustainable decision-making that benefits both current and future generations.



6 Helping to Create Bilingual, Safe and Diverse Communities

A. Bilingual Communications

During 2024 - 2025 we have started to increase the creation of bilingual communications, including Council Agendas and social media.

We recognise there is still further work to do to ensure all communications and media are fully bilingual.

B. Support for Welsh Language and Culture

Annual sponsorship of the local Eisteddfod, supporting events featuring Welsh artists (including the Summer Extravaganza and Christmas Light Switch-On), and working with Menter Dinefwr to deliver activities such as St David's Day celebrations, helping to promote and celebrate the Welsh language and culture within the community.

C. Community Safety

Partnership working with Dyfed-Powys Police, Carmarthenshire Regeneration, and the Event Safety Advisory Group (ESAG) to ensure Council events are safe, well managed and accessible for residents and visitors.

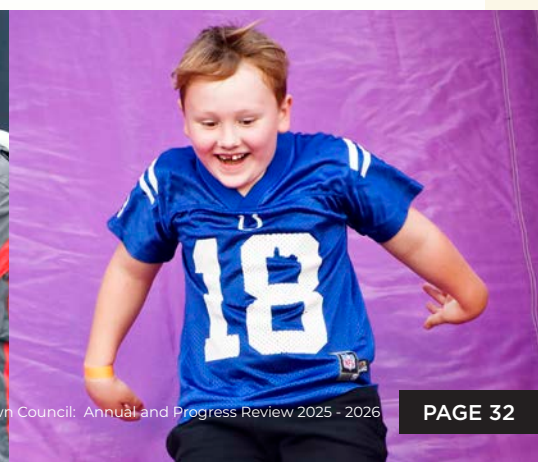

The Council will also continue to strengthen community engagement, ensuring that residents have meaningful opportunities to shape local priorities and initiatives.

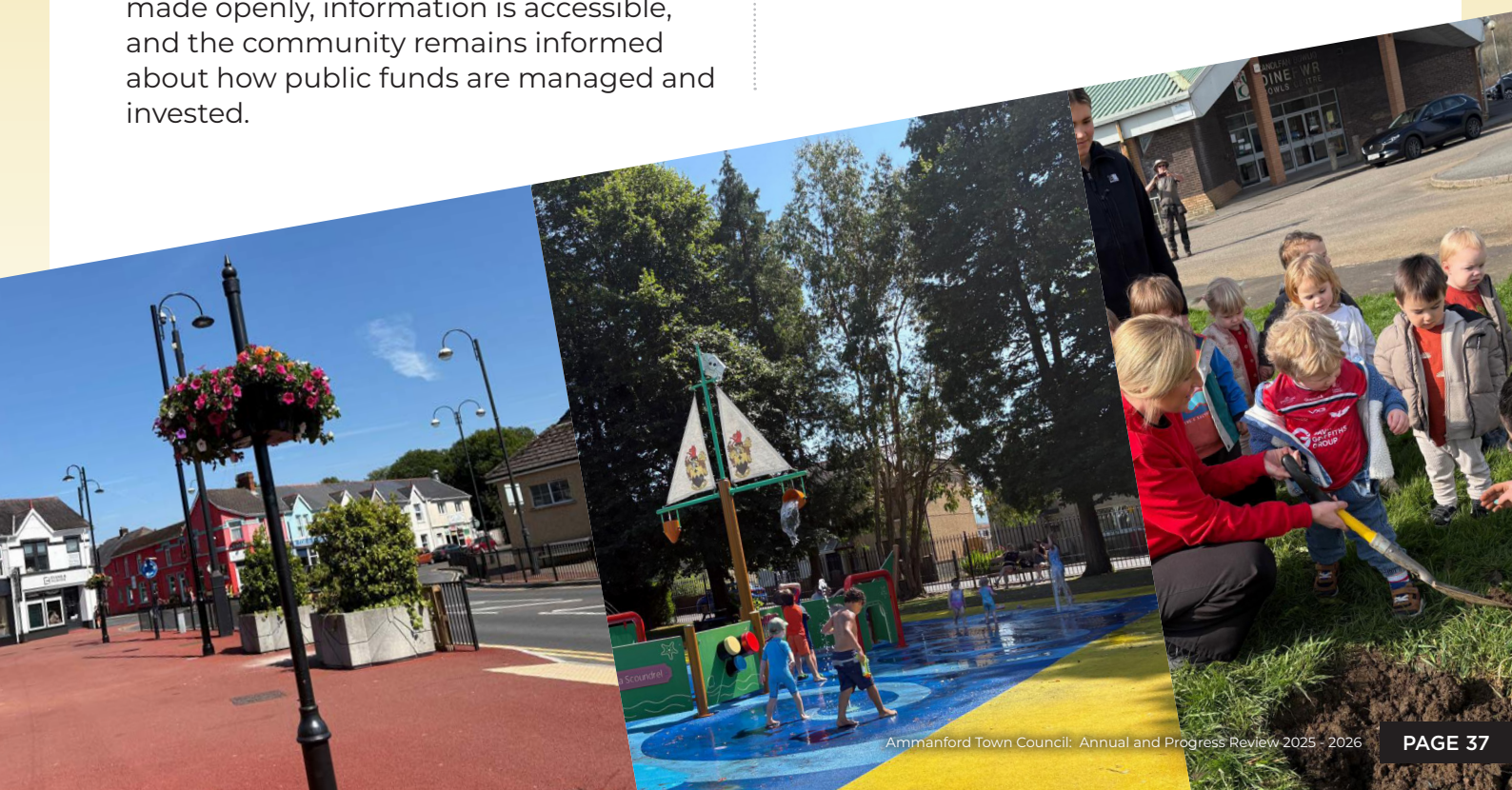
