#### Foreword from the Mayor 2024-25

It is with great pride that I present this year's Annual Report on behalf of Ammanford Town Council. As Mayor, I have had the privilege of witnessing first-hand the strength, spirit and resilience of our community throughout the year. I'd like to thank my fellow Councillor's for their support, and our dedicated officers for their work in keeping us moving forward.

This has been a year of connection and celebration, from our vibrant summer event and well-being initiatives to our sparkly Christmas light switch-on. Our parks have been full of activity, our events have been well attended and our efforts to promote health, inclusion and sustainability have continued to grow.

This year has brought challenges, particularly around the future of our historic Town Hall and the ongoing efforts to address historical accounting and governance issues. Following critical reports issued by Audit Wales covering the period from 2016-17 to 2023-24, the Council has undertaken significant measures to address identified deficiencies in governance and financial management.

Audit Wales have worked with Ammanford Town Council to finalise the earlier years of accounts. Interim Officers, appointed by the current Members, have ensured completion of the 2022-23 and 2023-24 years of account. This information can be found on our website.

In the Full Council meeting of the 28th of April 2025, the Council received a detailed end-of-year report (2024-25) from the Council's Responsible Financial Officer, showing all funds from this financial year have been accounted for and financial procedures are now robust, transparent, and properly managed.

The current Ammanford Town Council are fully committed to serving the people of Ammanford with the highest standards of care and responsibility. Every penny gathered through the local precept is used to enhance our community, and we are determined to ensure that public funds are managed effectively and for the benefit of all.

Ongoing efforts will continue to build upon this progress and further enhance public confidence.

#### Introduction

Ammanford Town Council has a statutory duty to prepare and publish two Annual Reports.

Section 52 of the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021 requires Ammanford Town Council to, as soon as reasonably practicable after the end of each financial year (31 March), prepare and publish an Annual Report about the Council's priorities, activities and achievements over the previous year.

Section 40 of the Well-Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 requires Ammanford Town Council to publish a report annually on the progress made in meeting the Carmarthenshire Public Services Board's local well-being objectives. The report must be published as soon as reasonably practicable following the end of the financial year (31 March) to which the report relates.

There are many over-lapping elements associated with the production of these reports so for reasons of practicality and to avoid duplication, Ammanford Town Council has prepared this Annual Report, combining the Council's Section 52 requirements and the Council's progress in meeting the Section 40 requirements.

Over the past year, Ammanford Town Council has faced a range of significant challenges. In addition to supporting our community through the ongoing cost-of-living crisis and increasing demand for local services, the Council has had to address historical difficulties in maintaining up-to-date audit and financial reporting. This lack of timely audits had previously been a concern for both residents and regulators. However, through determined action and a commitment to good governance, the Council has now brought all outstanding audit and financial documentation fully up to date. This important achievement demonstrates our focus on transparency, accountability, and building renewed trust with the people of Ammanford.

Whilst managing these challenges alongside rising costs, limited resources, and the need to support vulnerable groups, the Council has remained dedicated to delivering real improvements and value for the community and our continued investment in parks, green spaces, and sporting facilities ensures Ammanford remains a healthy, active, and vibrant place to live.

During 2025–2026, Ammanford Town Council will be taking a fresh look at its aims and objectives to ensure that our work continues to meet the evolving needs of the community. We are committed to engaging with residents, local groups, and partner organisations to identify new priorities and set clear, achievable goals for the future. This process will help shape our projects and investments over the coming years, ensuring that the Council remains responsive, forward-thinking, and focused on delivering the greatest possible benefit for Ammanford and its people.

Through collaborative working with local partners, community groups, and residents, Ammanford Town Council strives to build a stronger, healthier, and more sustainable town, embracing the principles of long-term thinking, prevention, integration, and community involvement.


We are proud to share this report as a transparent record of our progress and a foundation for continuous improvement in the well-being of the residents we serve.

#### The Ward

Ammanford Town Council serves the town of Ammanford and surrounding communities. Ammanford is a town and community in <u>Carmarthenshire</u>, <u>Wales</u>. At the 2021 census the community had a population of 5,445, and the wider built-up area had a population of 8,285. Ammanford is represented by four electoral wards within Carmarthenshire.

#### Local facilities and Services Provided by Ammanford Town Council

Ammanford Town Council is responsible for a range of local facilities and services, including:

- Ammanford Park (including children's play area, tennis courts, cricket facilities, bowling green)
- Carregamman Park (community park and green space)
- Ammanford Recreational Playing Fields and skatepark
- Ammanford War Memorial and Remembrance services
- Town centre planters, hanging baskets, and floral displays
- Maintenance of Park public benches
- Christmas lights and the annual Christmas light switch-on event
- Public toilets (Ammanford Park & Margeret Street Carpark)
- Supporting local organisations, schools, and community groups through grants
- Co-ordinating community events, such as the Ammanford Extravaganza, Christmas Light Switch-On, and Community Tennis and Basketball events.

#### **About the Carmarthenshire Public Services Board**

The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 established a statutory board, known as a Public Services Board (PSB), in each local authority area in Wales. The PSB is a collection of public bodies working together to improve the well-being of Carmarthenshire. As a group, the PSB must improve the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being of Carmarthenshire by working to achieve the 7 Well-being goals. The PSB assessed the state of economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being and published a well-being plan (2023-2028) setting out local objectives and the steps required to meet them. The PSB must follow the sustainable development principle - meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.

Carmarthenshire PSB's statutory members are: Carmarthenshire County Council; Hywel Dda University Health Board; Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service & Natural Resources Wales About Carmarthenshire Public Services Board Carmarthenshire PSB's other partners are: Coleg Sir Gâr; University of Wales Trinity Saint David; Dyfed Powys Police; Dyfed-Powys Police and Crime Commissioner; Department for Work & Pensions; Carmarthenshire Association of Voluntary Services; Welsh Government; Probation Service; Bannau Brycheiniog National Park Authority

The Carmarthenshire PSB has set 5 objectives for 2023-2028 and Ammanford Town Council is required to report our progress in helping to achieve these goals.

#### **Ammanford Town Council's Role**

While Ammanford Town Council is not a statutory PSB member, it plays a key role in supporting the PSB's objectives at a local level. The Council contributes by:

- Organising community events that foster cohesion and inclusion.
- Providing and maintaining facilities that encourage active lifestyles and environmental stewardship.
- Supporting cultural activities and the promotion of the Welsh language.
- Embedding the **Five Ways of Working** (Long-term, Prevention, Integration, Collaboration, Involvement) in local projects and decision-making.

Through these contributions, Ammanford Town Council helps to ensure that local priorities reflect the broader well-being goals for Carmarthenshire, creating a joined-up approach to improving quality of life for residents.

#### Carmarthenshire PSB's well-being objectives (2023–2028):

#### 1. A sustainable economy and fair employment:

Supporting a resilient and inclusive economy that provides fair job opportunities.

#### 2. Improved health and reduced health inequalities:

Enhancing physical and mental health for all residents, focusing on equity.

Taking meaningful action to tackle climate change and protect biodiversity.

#### 4. Tackling poverty and its impacts:

Addressing the root causes and consequences of poverty in communities.

#### 5. Creating bilingual, safe, and diverse communities:

Promoting cultural inclusion, community safety, and use of the Welsh language.

#### Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015

The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 was passed to improve the social, economic, environmental and cultural Well-being of Wales. The Act places a duty that public bodies are expected to carry out. A duty means Ammanford Town Council must do this by law.

This Act requires each local authority area in Wales to set up a PSB, bringing together key local organisations' and agencies to work in partnership for the well-being of residents and communities. The PSB's role is to set shared objectives, develop a local well-being plan, and collaborate to tackle challenges and improve outcomes across Carmarthenshire.

The Well-being duty states:

"Each public body must carry out sustainable development by setting and publishing objectives ("well-being objectives") designed to maximise its contribution to achieving each of the well-being goals and taking all reasonable steps to meet those objectives."

#### **National Well-being Goals**

The Act sets out seven Wellbeing Goals which public services must work towards to improve the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of all our communities.

#### The Five Ways of Working

In order that Ammanford Town Council apply the sustainable development principle, there are five ways of working which we must follow: Long term; Prevention; Integration; Collaboration and Involvement.

The Council must ensure that everything we do has taken these ways of working into consideration. The Council must think more about the long term; work better with local communities; look to prevent problems and take a more joined-up approach.

This will ensure we work together in a more robust and effective partnership approach.



#### **How Ammanford Town Council Incorporates the Five Ways of Working**

Ammanford Town Council recognises the importance of embedding the Five Ways of Working as set out in the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, to contribute meaningfully to the Public Services Board (PSB) objectives. While the Council has already worked in a way that reflects these principles in practice, formal adoption and integration into our governance framework has been delayed due to a necessary period of governance and financial catch-up following historic challenges.

With these priorities now substantially addressed, the Council is committed to fully embedding the Five Ways of Working — Long-term, Prevention, Integration, Collaboration, and Involvement — into our planning, decision-making, and performance monitoring processes. This will ensure that our activities are strategically aligned with the PSB objectives, deliver sustained benefits to our community, and are transparent and accountable to the people of Ammanford.

#### 2. Improving Well-being and Reducing Health Inequalities

#### a.Ammanford park playground

Ammanford Town Council refurbished Ammanford play park to a quality facility being available for the local community. The project is part of future projects by the Town Council to upgrade poor or unusable parks brought back to life for the benefit of communities across the Town through renovation works, and improved accessibility with new access to all abilities with modern technology.

The park is vital in providing opportunities for children and infants to get active, delivering significant physical and mental health and wellbeing benefits to participants. Accessible facilities in parks are particularly critical.

Alongside this investment of £120,000, Ammanford Town Council will also work to deliver a range of activities across several park sites. To provide friendly, sociable, opportunities to get active through local interaction.

b. Tennis Courts at Ammanford Park were re-surfaced £68,565.81 funding from Lawn Tennis Association and match funding of £20,000 from Ammanford Town Council. This involved resurfacing and painting the courts and installing new perimeter fencing and access gate. April 1<sup>st</sup> 2025– March 31 2025 we have had 34 family annual memberships, in addition there have been 645 bookings to use the courts during this period.

Ammanford Park on Tir-Y-Dail Lane, the tennis courts offer a welcoming and accessible destination for both casual players and serious enthusiasts. The facility includes three hard-surfaced outdoor courts, all managed by Ammanford Town Council.

These courts have recently benefited from significant improvement under a UK-wide refurbishment initiative supported by the LTA Park Tennis Project—enhancing accessibility through upgraded booking systems and new gate-access technology

Visitors enjoy a pleasant, relaxed environment—surrounded by greenery, with easy access to nearby amenities and attractive views that enrich the playing experience. Booking a court is hassle-free via low-cost pay-and-play options or through affordable annual family and student passes.

- c. Free weekly tennis and basketball sessions for children aged 5-11 years old during the school summer holidays encouraging physical activity, in partnership with Actif Sir Gar.
- d. The council successfully delivered a new play park, enhancing recreational facilities for families and young people. This project reflects our commitment to improving community spaces.
- e. Ammanford Playground was refurbished and re-opened in May 2024. New equipment included a zipline, toddler area and inclusive equipment such as a trampoline and roundabout which are both suitable for wheelchair users.
- f. Following feedback from the community, a secondary self-closing gate was installed at Ammanford Playground to improve safety.
- g. To coincide with the re-opening of the playground, the Town Council also contracted a local artist to spray the container at the Splashpad. The vibrant and colorful design greatly enhances the area.



- Family-friendly and accessible: Located near transport links and warm, fun surroundings—ideal for quick visits or extended park days.
- Safe and low risk: As with most splash pads, there's little to no standing water, removing many of the common safety concerns associated with deeper water play areas.




#### Ammanford Christmas Light Switch-On - 2024

On **Saturday 30 November 2024**, the Town Centre came alive with festive magic for the **Annual Christmas Light Switch-On**. The event featured **live entertainment**, **children's activities**, **delicious food stalls**, **and a spectacular fire show**, all building up to the much-anticipated arrival of **Father Christmas** to switch on the town's Christmas lights. This free, inclusive community event brought together people of all ages to celebrate the start of the festive season, fostering community spirit and spreading Christmas cheer throughout Ammanford.









#### Freedom of the Town

Ammanford Town Council were privileged to award the Freedom of the Town to the Ammanford branch of the Royal British Legion for their service to the community.

Since 1921 the Ammanford Branch has served the ex-military community and their families, raising tens of thousands of pounds with the Poppy Appeal, over £170,000 in the last 10 years.

Now, over 100 years later, they are continuing with that work which is only possible by the generosity of all who contribute annually to the Poppy Appeal.

There are very many who have benefited locally, and some continue to receive ongoing support. The Royal British Legion, Ammanford Branch has not only served our veterans but also the community of Ammanford as a whole. Since the first Remembrance Service and Parade in 1922, they have organised and conducted the annual event here in the town.

- c. Participation in ©AGA Toolkit Pilot Study for Community & Town Councils. The AGA Toolkit Pilot Study for Community & Town Councils is a research initiative aimed at assessing and enhancing the democratic health of community and town councils in Wales.
- d. Environmental Improvements: New solar powered, energy-efficient lighting installed at Ammanford Park. The benefits that were realised from this project are listed below: -
  - Renewable Energy Generation The solar installation has successfully generated renewable energy, reducing reliance on non-renewable sources.
  - Energy Bills The project has provided solar energy for the facilities within the park. By supplementing power usage with solar energy this keeps costs down.
  - Environmental Impact Reduction The installation is supporting measurable reduction in CO<sub>2</sub>
     emissions, supporting sustainability goals and contributing to Ammanford's greener initiatives.
  - Community Benefit The project has provided an opportunity to promote renewable energy awareness among park visitors, residents, and community groups. It has also provided a facility that has lighting around our park during nighttime making it safer for residents when walking or running in our park. The lights are motion sensitive so they are on a low brightness until someone walks by

and then they will illuminate on full power until the individual has passed. There has also been feedback from the police representative at local taskforce meeting, who welcomed the introduction of solar lighting. They expressed how solar lighting has contributed to a reduction in vandalism and anti-social behavior by 100% since Ammanford installed it in the Recreation Ground.

• Infrastructure Improvement – The installation of solar lights has enhanced the park's infrastructure and has not increased the operational costs.

## **FINANCIAL SUMMARY 2024/2025**

The main source of Ammanford Town Council's income is the **Precept** £397,646.86, which is the portion of council tax paid by households in Ammanford that is allocated directly to the Town Council. This funding enables the Council to deliver services, maintain facilities, and support community projects. Ammanford Town Council does not receive any income from Business Rates.

Additional income £224,696.38 is generated through a variety of sources, including grant funding, hire of the tennis courts, contributions from sports clubs towards the maintenance of sports fields, event income, insurance claims, and other service-related receipts.

On the expenditure side £477,415, the Council's spending covers core administration, open spaces, parks and playground maintenance, community financial assistance, community development activities, and members' allowances, as well as specific commitments such as the upkeep of the town's church clock. At the end of the financial year, the Council maintained general reserves sufficient to cover approximately four months of net revenue expenditure, in line with recommended good practice for financial resilience.

In addition to general reserves £132,548.95, the Council has **earmarked reserves** totalling £154,071.95. These funds are set aside for **capital projects** and to provide **match funding** when applying for external grants, ensuring the Council is well positioned to support future community improvements and investment opportunities.
